National Orange Show Set

The opening of the 53rd National Orange Show in San Bernardino and the annual Kite Festival in Ocean Beach top the list of current and upcoming things to see in the Southland. Here is the list, as compiled by the Automobile Club of Southern California:

ANAHEIM: A Motorama, displaying vehicles of all types, will be held in Anaheim Convention Center March 6-10.

IMPERIAL: The annual California Mid-Winter Fair will be held at the Imperial County Fairgrounds through Sunday. Featured are agricultural displays, art exhibits, a gem and mineral show, and midway and evening entertainment. Hours are noon to 10 p.m. through Friday and 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

LA CANADA: The annual Camellia Show will be held at Descanso Gardens Saturday and Sunday. The show is free.

LOS ANGELES : "California and World Trade," an exhibit tracing the development of trade in California, will be featured in the County Museum of Natural History through June.

An exhibit titled "100 Years of American Sheet Music" will be featured in the Tower Gallery of city hall through March 6.

"Japanese in Los Angeles," a pictorial exhibit of the history of Little Tokyo from 1890 to 1967, will be featured in the County Museum of Natural History through March 24.

"Exploring the Sky," where viewers are shown the Southern hemisphere and have the Southern Cross and the Clouds of Magellan explained to them, will be featured in the Griffith Park Planetarium through Sunday. Hours are 3 and 8:30 p.m. through Friday, and 1:30, 3, 4:30, and 8:30 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

OCEANSIDE: Mission Art Days will be held March 9 and 10 at Mission San Luis Rey. Featured will be exhibits of paintings, wood carvings, metal work and fabrics from early mission days.

PASO ROBLES: Exhibits of early mission days paintings, wood carvings, metal works and fabrics will be exhibited in observance of Mission Art Days at Mission San Miguel March 9 and 10.

POMONA: Arabian Horse Shows will be held at 2 and 3:30 p.m. each Sunday through May 26 at the California State Polytechnic College Campus.

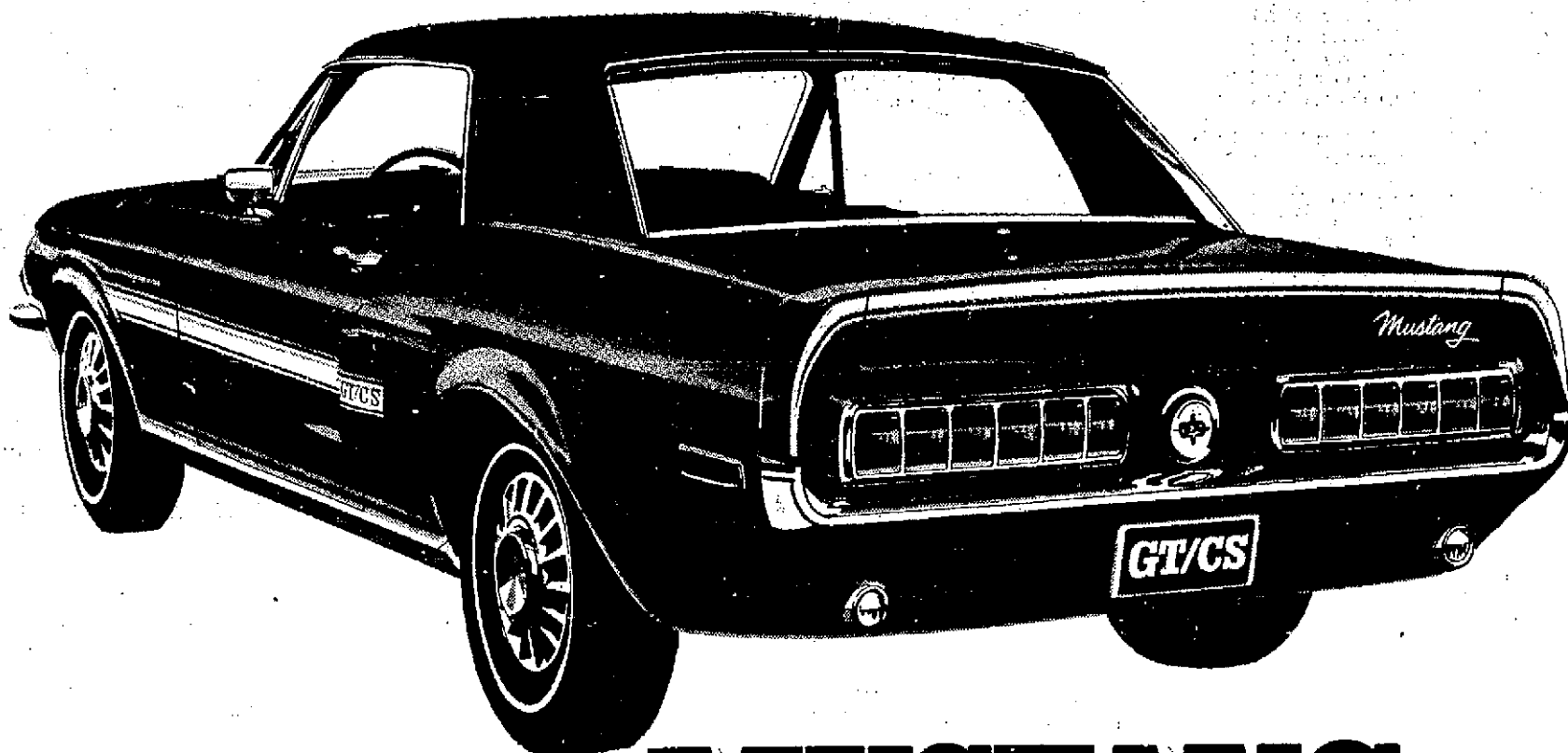

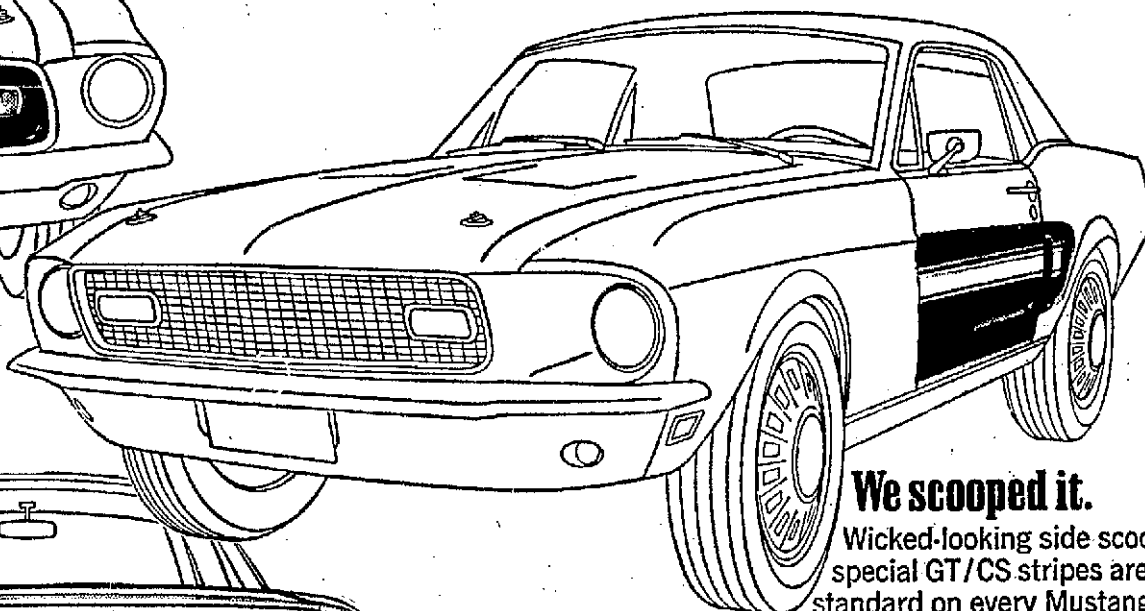

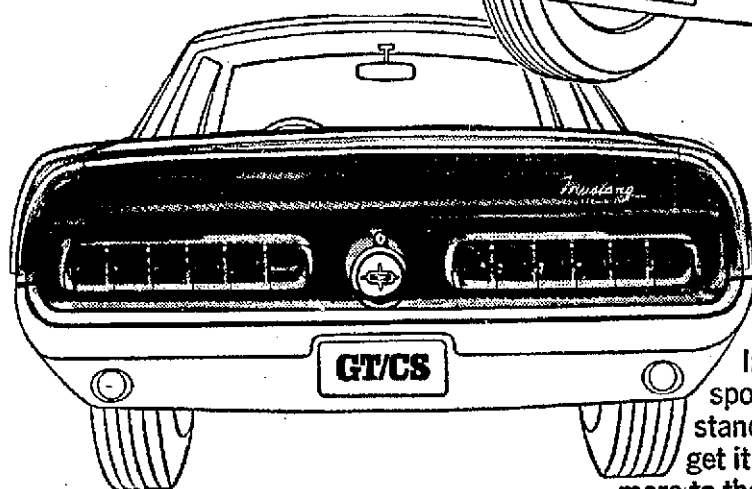
